Autopsy reports prepared by State Department of Forensic Science and Coroner's reports are public records.

Dear Mr. Holman:

You have requested an opinion from this office which opinion request reads as follows:

"From time to time I am called upon by insurance companies for copies of Coroner's Reports and Autopsy reports (autopsies done by the State Dept. of Forensic Science). I would like an opinion from your office on whether I should give out these reports, particularly autopsy reports. Also, would there be any difference in giving out the reports on natural deaths and accidents as opposed to homicide cases?"

Autopsy reports done by the State Department of Forensic Science are public records. State law specifically provides that such reports are open to public inspection. Code of Alabama 1975, § 36-18-2.

Coroner's reports would likewise be public records and would be open to public inspection. Code of Alabama 1975 § 36-12-40.

Such records could be withheld from public inspection only when disclosure would be detrimental to the best interests of the public. Stone v. Consolidated Pub. Co., 404 So.2d 678 (Ala. 1981). For example, if the release of such reports would compromise a criminal investigation or prosecution they could be withheld from the public. Informal Opinion of the Attorney General, No. 84-00118.

I hope I have satisfactorily answered your inquiry with regard to this matter.
